GETTING STARTED

1. Power the Monitor

a. Plug the AC adapter into the power input jack on the side of the monitor or into the power plug at the end of the breakout cable.

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2. Connecting the A/V (Audio/Video)


- a. Plug the USB end of the breakout cable into the A/V input jack on the side of the monitor.
- **b.** Connect RCA plugs on the end of the breakout cable into video and audio source.

3. Camera Mount

- **a.** Attach the camera mount on the bottom of the monitor.
- **b.** Attach the camera mount on your camera's shoemount.
- c. Tighten or loosen adjustment screw to position monitor.
